Hoopeston Area deals with loss of second educator For the second time in as many months, the Hoopeston community is mourning the loss of an educator. Dan O. Park, 55, suffered a massive heart attack Friday morning while at school. He was pronounced dead at 9:10 a.m. at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital emergency room, despite heroic CPR efforts, said Vermilion County Coroner Peggy Johnson in a statement released Friday.

Mr. Park's death came two months to the day after 53-year-old Superintendent Mark Conolly died, also of a massive heart attack.

According to reports, Mr. Park was

found in his office by Hoopeston Area Athletic Director Kevin Root, who immediately began CPR. Personnel attempted to use the school's defibrillator. Upon arrival, Hoopeston emergency medical personnel assumed CPR efforts.

Mr. Park was born Nov. 1, 1951 at Danville. He graduated from Hoopeston-East Lynn High School in 1970. In high school he set a record for the 100-meter dash, which has been tied but never broken.

He attended Illinois State University and received his Masters degree in physical education from Southern Illinois University.

He first taught at Lick Creek, then returned to Hoopeston in 1988, where he taught junior high English, PE and coached wrestling, football, high school girls basketball, junior high boys basketball and high school boys track.

The hallways at Hoopeston Area High School were quiet Friday as staff and students mourned the loss of the popular teacher.

Grief counselors were on hand Friday to talk to students and staff and are expected to be available Tuesday, as well.

In a letter sent home with students Friday, Principal Hank Hornbeck urged parents to talk to their children about Mr. Park's death and also accompany students who wished to attend a memorial service for him. That service will be held at 11 a.m. Monday at Hoopeston Area High School gymnasium, followed by a meal in the cafeteria and time to visit with the family.

In accordance with Mr. Park's wishes, he was to be cremated with a private burial service of his ashes at Floral Hill Cemetery.

Mr. Park is survived by his wife, Barbara; son, Alexander; daughter Sydney; mother, Fleta; and sister, Dawn.

He was preceded in death by his father, Robert. He was a member of First Presbyterian Church, Hoopeston, and the Hoopeston Education Association. He most recently served on the education association's negotiating committee.
