







SPRINGFIELD—Fire department personnel from 21 communities were expected to attend a workshop in Wellington Sunday to receive computers, software and training to improve their ability to report and record vital information about fires and other incidents.

The equipment and training were provided at no cost to the departments by the Office of the State Fire Marshal.

The national Fire Incident Reporting System is an electronic system designed to help fire department report and maintain computerized records of fires and other incidents in a uniform manner. It was developed by the U.S. Fire administration in partnership with the National Fire Information Council to simplify reporting and en-

# Zoning administrator reminds citizens of city ordinances

Zoning administrator John Holt is asking Hoopeston residents to heed two city ordinances concerning house numbers and garbage.

According to Ordinance 12.24.020, all houses must have numbers at least three inches in length that are legible and placed in a conspicuous place at the side or above the front door of the building. Holt asks that residents comply with the ordinance so emergency responders, including police, fire and ambulance personnel, can locate homes in an emergency.

Also, he said, Ordinance 8.04.080 requires that all garbage be placed in containers with tight-fitting lids or plastic bags tightly tied. No loose garbage, paper or boxes are allowed. Also, the ordinance says garbage should be placed at curbside no sooner than 12 hours before the day of collection and must be removed from the curb within 12 hours of collection. Failure to comply could result in a citation.
