

Wisconsin man buys theaters, Boardman reflects on run

The Lorraine Theatres have a new owner.

Kevin Alvarez, of Burlington, Wis., purchased the theaters last week from Greg Boardman, who has owned the Lorraine for nearly two decades.

The theaters were brought to Alvarez' attention by a film buyer who works with Alvarez at his four-screen theater in Burlington. The buyer saw the theaters listed on e-bay.

"I just fell in love with it," Alvarez said. "It's a beautiful theater. It's a hidden treasure. I think."

Alvarez purchased the Plaza Theater in Burlington nearly five years ago. The 15 months, which caused a hardship for Alvarez and

his family. "We went to the theater almost every weekend," he said.

That venture was a trial by fire for the former Department of Corrections employee, as he learned to schedule films, staff the theater and order concessions.

With those lessons behind him, Alvarez said he is ready to take on the challenges of running the Lorraines. The focus on family films comes, in part, because of his own family. He and his wife, Janell, have four children, Joel, 15, Toni, 13, Bryce, 10 and Shawn, 9.

owner Greg Boardman, said he plans to concentrate on a couple of new ventures in California. But he has good memories of his time owning the Lorraine.

"Sandy, and I have owned the Lorraine Theatre for almost 20 years," he said. "We are very proud of taking it from a position of merely being a small-town theatre that few attended, to one, because of its presentation, known for 100 miles around in all directions.

"I am also proud of the many big promotions (Twister, ID4, Apollo 13, Pearl Harbor) we have done over the years, which resulted in television coverage on many occasions. The Lorraine Theatre brings thousands of people from out of town, into town each year. It is a huge asset to the community and I believe will remain so."

The Lorraine was built in 1922 and remodeled in 1937, when restrooms and air conditioning were also added.

Boardman purchased the theater in 1987 and began working on the interior and exterior, have the roof re-

placed, brickwork done, seats reupholstered, new carpeting, restoring the marquee and "chase lights." He also installed new poster display cases and decorative street lights, new tile flooring in the center section and he redid seating for more leg room but still maintained seating for 501 patrons.

In 1992, after more than two years of research, Boardman remodeled the entire booth and auditorium equipment, bringing it up to Hollywood standards for presentations. A computerized ticketing system was also installed.

In 1998, Boardman opened the Lorraine II, turning a former storefront into an 80-seat theater.
