## **Hoopeston Council hears of economic development progress**

Hoopeston's efforts in economic development are not going unnoticed by those outside the community.

At Tuesday night's Hoopeston City Council meeting, economic development director Shannon Ruh talked about attending last week's Community Development Institute in Moline, where Hoopeston's efforts were noted by Tom Jacobs of Jacobs & Associates, TIF consultants, and a representative of Shaw Environmental. "People from the outside have a lot of positive things to say about Hoopeston," she said.

Also, Ruh said, Hoopeston was the most-represented community at the conference with its sixmember contingent.

With Ruh, others attending were Jean Minick, city clerk Gail Lane, Connie Cain, Pat Fraley and Judi Benjamin.

In a presentation to the council, Ruh listed several things the group learned at the conference, including:

- Attitude has as much to do about development than anything else
- •People from the outside are talking about progress in Hoopeston and have positive things to say – Hoopeston was used by many speakers as an example of a community making taking positive steps to revitalize the City.
- Having someone that can connect groups in the community is important in development – the economic development position has helped with this.
- •Groups that sit around in the community and talk (and

> complain) need someone to work with them to highlight the positives.

- •Site Selection Hoopeston is not as prepared as it could be. More sites under option – infrastructure issues
- •Community Development cannot be accomplished without the involvement and input of the citizens. If there is no vested interest they won't be on board.
- •Everyone is a stakeholder in one form or another.
- •Learn how to collaborate
- •We have a lot CAVE (Citizens Against Virtually Everything) people

Everyone is encouraged to attend the meeting to learn what the Mainstreet Program has to offer Hoopeston. In general, the program provides know-how and technical assistance to communities for downtown revitalization.

The council unanimously approved a resolution supporting participation in the program.

In unrelated action, the council:
