### Longtime director stepping down after Sweetheart Pageant

For over 30 years, Dolores Crabtree has served as executive director of The National Sweetheart Pageant, making sure all aspects of the show came together successfully.

This year, Crabtree will be overseeing those details for the last time.

In a letter to festival-goers, Crabtree compares the pageant as a wagon wheel, with the contestants as the hub and, as the spokes, herself, the production director, emcee, lighting, sound and dressing room crews, as well as prop movers and the judges. The wheel, she wrote, is held together by the rim, comprised of the housing committee, the groups who sponsor tours, give gifts and sponsor meals and the chaperones.

Thanking those with whom she's worked over the years, Crabtree said that since her age and the years equal over 100, "I feel like it's time to move on."

For this, her last year, 30 young women will vie for the title of National Sweetheart. The candidates are:

**Arizona**, Erin Brittany Nurss, 22, of Tucson. Recently graduated from the University of Arizona with a degree in nutritional sciences, she is now pursuing a master's degree in public health. As her talent, she will perform a lyrical dance to "Imagine" by John Lennon.

**California**, Jennifer K. Lee, 20, of San Francisco, who will perform the piano selection "Excerpt of Rachmaninoff, Prelude Opus 32, No. 12." She attends U.C.L.A., where she studies English/communications studies. Lee hopes to become a television news anchor.

**District of Columbia**, 23-year-old Michelle Orel Crosby, of Bethesda, Md. A 2006 graduate of American University in Washington, D.C., she earned a bachelor's degree in international studies and is the co-founder and executive director of The National Council for Innovation.
