Vermilion County Health Department sets area flu clinics

With 4.000 doses of seasonal influenza vaccine on hand, the Vermilion County Health Department is announcing its flu clinic schedule for this year. Health officials say the on-time delivery of flu vaccine is a pleasant departure from recent years. "We have been frustrated with delays in vaccine shipments the last three years which have led to artificial shortages and a great deal of confusion and frustration for the public," according to health administrator Steve Laker. He said delayed shipments last year caused a surplus of vaccine at the health department to go unused. "The delays cost us money and certainly impacted the public's confidence in

the flu program," he said, adding, "we are pleased to have the vaccine on hand and we are ready to go."

With no vaccine shortages this year, Laker said the health department joins the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in encouraging those most at risk from flu complications to get vaccinated early, including anyone over the age of 50 and those with chronic health conditions who might face complications from flu.

The health department will offer flu shots for adults 18 years of age and older at their Danville facility, 200 South College Street:

- Tuesday, Oct. 2 8am 4pm
- Wednesday Oct. 3 8am 4pm
- Tuesday, Oct. 9 8am 4pm
- Wednesday, Oct. 17 8am 7pm External county clinics will be held at:
- Georgetown Fair Banquet Center, 413 N. Seminary, Georgetown, from 1-5:30 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 11.
- Hoopeston Multi Agency, 206 S. First Ave., Hoopeston, from 1-5:30 p.m. Monday, Oct. 15.

The health department will also offer a drive-thru flu shot clinic for those who have trouble walking. Those who wish to get their flu shot during the drive-thru clinic must pre-register by calling the Vermilion County Health Department at (217) 431-2662. Drive-thru clinic for pre-registered, non-ambulatory individuals will be held at the health department's Danville facility Saturday, October 13, from 8a.m. – noon.

Additional clinics may be scheduled later in October, based on need. "We will offer flu shots as long as we have vaccine," Laker said.

Cost of adult flu immunizations this year will remain at \$30. "We still do not know what the federal government will be providing for reimbursement for Medicare, but we feel we need to move ahead with our clinics, so



we will hold the line on the cost," Laker said. Medicare cards should be provided at the time of immunization.

The health department has reached agreement with Health Alliance to provide flu shots for their senior clients; those eligible include only those seniors with Health Alliance HMO 20 and Health Alliance PPO 10.

Pregnant women should contact their health care providers about flu shots. The health department will be offering flu vaccine for children, but those flu shots will only be available by appointment. Call the health department for information.

Most people who get the flu recover completely in one to two weeks, but public health officials said some people develop serious and potentially life-threatening medical complications, such as pneumonia.

Over the past decade, influenza and pneumonia have

been associated with an average of 3,500 deaths a year in Illinois, according to the state health department. Nationally, the CDC says about 200,000 people in the United States are hospitalized each year because of flu complications, and 36,000 people die every year from flu.

The flu shot schedule is posted on the health department's website at www.vchd.org, or call the health department at 431-2662 for more information.
