Dan Breeding, exotic animal trainer and former Hoopeston resident, gave local students some face time with some of his critters Friday.

Students got to meet Leeza, a gibbon; Prickles, an African crested porcupine; a Eurasian eagle owl named Eugene; and Auggie, an American alligator, during performances Friday.

Prickles got the most time on stage for Hoopeston Area Middle School students, as Breeding talked about the highlights on her quills - "and she didn't even have to go to the beauty salon," Breeding told the students.

Breeding explained porcupines' quills and told stu-

dents that the animals really don't shoot them at enemies. "That only happens in cartoons," he said. "Don't get your information from cartoons."

Eugene, the eagle owl, tethered to Breeding by a rope, spread his wings and flew a bit for the crowd, and Auggie's appearance drew several concerned sounds from students.

It was Leeza that drew the most smiles from the crowd as she hung from Breeding's arm and even perched on teacher Rich Stipp's head as Breeding walked her throughout the high school auditorium.
