Response system offers bonus to new area subscribers

Editor's note: part of this article was erroneously published in Tuesday's issue. Here is the entire article.

Now is the best time to have Lifeline Emergency Response System installed in your home. Not only is the installation free until December 10, but those who have Lifeline installed through November will be send a bonus gift bag from the company. Included in the bag are a wipe-off board for emergency contact numbers, one compact money-saving fluorescent light bulb from the Phillips Company (parent company of Lifeline) and one combination magnifying glass and flashlight.

Lifeline is a device that easily attaches to home phone.

When help is needed, such as for a fall or health problem, the subscriber can push the button he or she wears and receive an immediate response. A Lifeline representative will speak with the subscriber and will get needed help, calling those people listed in the subscriber's file as responders (family member, neighbor, etc.) When a responder is reached, that person would go to the subscriber's home to check on the person.

If the subscriber needs immediate help, he or she would tell the Lifeline representative to call an ambulance. And, if the subscriber is unable to answer when Lifeline answers the call, the representative would immediately begin contacting responders. If no responders were available, police or emergency medical technicians would be called.

Lifeline is available for little more than \$1 per day and can be a lifesaver in an emergency, particularly for a person living alone.

There are some subscribers who may qualify through income guidelines for free Lifeline service.
