rabies vaccination tags affixed to their animals. City ordinance dictates a city pet license must be readily viewed on all pets kept within city limits. Animal Control will then be able to alleviate the stress of retrieving your animal at Vermilion County Animal Regulations in Danville by simply returning your pet home.

Purchasing a city pet license will provide the information necessary to compile a database of the city's pet population. City pet licenses are available at the Hoopeston Water Department window located in Hoopeston City Hall, 301 W. Main St.

The cost of pet licenses rage from only \$2 for vaccinated dogs and cats to \$10 for unvaccinated dogs and cats. Owners must provide their pet's rabies tag number at the time of purchase. A rabies vaccination tag affixed to your pet will assure a safe return home for pets and their owners.

Vermilion County Animal Regulation maintains vaccination records by the numbers engraved on the animal's tag. Those who need a tag may visit or call the Regulations office at 14775 Catlin/Tilton Rd., Danville, IL, (217) 443-2660 to acquire one or ensure the office's records show the updated information.

Thank you for your help and hopefully, together we can make Hoopeston a better place for our furry friends.

little control over. Many ingredients that are incorporated into the drugs that we rely on come from foreign countries ((India, China, etc.) which do not have very good inspection procedures of what they export. As a matter of fact, China has a very bad track record of killing their own people with bad drugs.

I think what concerns me the most is if our foreign suppliers become unable to sell us safe products, are we going to be able to start producing these things ourselves, or are we going to become reliant on them no matter what they sell us? I guess that would also be true of all the things manufactured in foreign countries now, that used to be made here.

Do you feel safe buying toys for your children, that were made in China?

Are you concerned about American-made medication you have to take that includes ingredients from foreign countries that do not inspect their exports?

We inspect most of what is made in this country whether it is bought here or exported to another country. China and India do not inspect their exports, at least not very well. The problems are caught here in this country.

Unfortunately, a very small amount of imports can be inspected by us. We just don't have the manpower. There are 3,249 pharmaceutical chemical manufacturers in foreign countries and two thirds of them have never been inspected by our FDA (that is 2,133 companies that we know nothing about). China has 714 companies of which the FDA will inspect 13 (1.8%) next year. India has 410 and the FDA will inspect 65 (15.8%) next year.

Why should we have to inspect them anyway? They are the ones exporting the goods, it should be their responsibility. I don't understand why we don't insist that they do a better job of inspection, and require them to stamp an approval of each item. If we find something

that they missed, penalize them like we do American companies. We have such labels like UL listed, FDA approved, etc. It is appalling that we do business with people that do not take on responsibility.

I am for free trade, but it requires that all participants take on responsibility if they want to become a member of world trade. At this point, China has proven that they are not yet among the nations' better exporters. How many illnesses or deaths have to happen before something is done?
