## Voters head to polls for municipal, township, school elections

Local voters head to the polls Tuesday, largely for uncontested races.

However, residents of Hoopeston's Ward 3 have a choice of two candidates, neither of whose names appears on the ballot.

Susan Comstock and Tony Hasbargen each filed to be a write-in candidate for the position which has been held by Bill Crusinberry.

Crusinberry is Hoopeston's sole candidate for mayor.

To vote for a write-in candidate, voters must color the circle next to "write in." then write the name of the candidate, said Vermilion County Clerk Lynn Foster.

The write-in process will slow vote tallying as judges will count the ballots by hand before taking them to Danville, Foster said, adding her office will try to post unofficial results Tuesday night; if not, they will be available by Wednesday afternoon.
