

## Economic developer position cut due to TIF budget shortfall

The local economy has had a big impact on Hoopeston's economic developer.

Dana Goodrum, who has held that post since October, was told Wednesday that her position was cut for budgetary reasons, effective that day.

"It was a surprise to me," Goodrum said in a telephone interview Thursday morning.

Alderman Bill Goodwine, city finance committee chairman, said officials saw maintaining an economic development director was not going to be feasible while

working on the 2009-10 budget.

The position is funded primarily through the city's Tax Increment Financing (TIF) fund, which had a budgeted \$55,000 loss for the year.

Hoopeston expects \$212,000 in income from TIFs 1, 2, and 3. Of that, \$30,000 is earmarked for TIF administration by Jacobs & Associates, Goodwine said.

The next biggest line item - at \$71,799 - is economic development. Of that, \$46,500

was set as the director's salary and an additional \$13,500 for director's medical insurance. The remainder was for Social Security and unemployment payments and \$8,000 for such things as seminars and travel.

Also coming out of TIF money are \$10,000 for the city's façade program; \$22,000 for reimbursable expenses to CVS for its development; and \$25,000 each for school projects and miscellaneous expenses.

Those expenditures left a balance of about \$29,000, but there were still budgeted expenses totaling \$83,500, in-

cluding \$42,000 to move sewer lines for the new motel; \$20,000 for unexpected motel costs; \$10,000 to repair the Willdon Building roof; and \$11,500 to Shaw Environmental for work to wrap up the city's part in receiving a No Further Remediation letter for property at Rtes. 1 and 9 where the motel is to be located, Goodwine said.

As of March 1, Hoopeston's TIF fund had \$549,000 in it but the shortfall budgeted for this year, along with \$400,000 pledged for the proposed Affordable Workforce Housing project, leaves little for anything else.

Looking at the numbers, Goodwine said the city council decided a full time director "was not a sustainable model for economic development."

Goodrum wishes she'd received more notice. However, "if that's really why they did it, I'm proud of the city for making a tough decision.".

She is concerned about the timing, while she is "in the middle of multiple projects that the city really needs. Unfortunately, I think the benefits of what we've been seeing and what we will be seeing in the next six months won't be worth the cost (of eliminating her position.)

Goodwine said the city council and economic devel-

opment steering committee will pick up much of the work. He also hopes to take advantage of assistance from Vermilion Advantage and especially Todd Lee.

Goodrum, a Hoopeston native, had served at the University of Illinois/Springfield, where she was a residen-

What she will do now is up in the air. "I don't know," she said. She will receive one month's salary as severance pay and "I'm very thankful for that." She will begin looking for work in larger cities, such as Chicago or Springfield, and relocate her family.
