

## HA plans for - but doesn't plan on - 8.9% increase in tax levy

Hoopeston Area School Board approved the 2009 estimated tax levy of \$3,202,000 but officials aren't planning on receiving that much.

The amount is 8.9 percent over last year's amount of \$2,940.513, Superintendent Hank Hornbeck said at Thursday's school board meeting.

Hornbeck said the district always approves a higher level than officials expect because if they approve a lower amount and actually could receive more, the district is held to the lower amount because that levy amount was approved.

Over the last five years, Hoopeston Area has averaged a 1.2 yearly increase. With the state of the economy, "if we get one percent, we'll be really happy," he said.

Hornbeck also released six-day enrollment figures. At 1,374, enrollment dropped by eight from last year. The loss includes two from Hoopeston Area and six less from Rossville-Alvin.

This year, Hoopeston Area has 44 Rossville-Alvin high school students.

The number also includes 22 migrant students.



In other business, the board:

- Is reconsidering its policy regarding home schooled youngsters taking part in extracurricular activities. The existing policy forbids home schooled students from participating and that ban may have to remain in place, based on Illinois High School Association regulations, Hornbeck said.
- Heard from Hornbeck that under new regulations, administrators' salaries and other compensation, must be posted on the district website. Administrators and their salaries include: Hornbeck, 103,000; Larry Maynard, high school principal, \$78,100; Anne Burton, middle school principal, \$60,000; Dan Walder, John Greer principal, \$60,000; Linda Sheppard, Honeywell principal, \$70,100; and Lori Eells, Maple principal, \$67,200.
- The collective bargaining agreement must also be put on the website, Hornbeck said.
