
A look back at the timeline of



2009 is almost gone, so it's time to take a look back at the Top 10 stories that made local headlines since the year was first a wee babe.

10) The flu. First it was called swine, then H1N1, plus there was the yearly strain. The area was lucky in that no fatalities were reported from either H1N1 or seasonal flu, the latter which impacted local schools in the latter months of the year.

9) An age-old mascot got a facelift this year as Hoopeston Area School District unveiled a new Jerky.

8) Rossville citizens were hot under the collar about residential fires many believed to be drug-related. After meeting among themselves, then with village officials, a Neighborhood Watch group was formed to try to curb criminal activity.

7) Crime in the area got off to a big start early this year with two shootings in January. The first occurred January 5, when Robert Israel Smith was shot multiple times with a small caliber handgun. Reports of the shooting caused both Hoopeston Area High School and Hoopeston Regional Health Center to go on lockdown.

An investigation into the incident, conducted by Vermilion County Sheriff's Department, was put on the back burner after Smith declined to help in the investigation.

The second shooting occurred January 11 in the 700 block of East Maple. Hoopeston resident Nathan W. Irvin was arrested and later pleaded guilty to unlawful possession of a weapon by a felon/cannabis control act. He is set to be sentenced January 26, 2010.

milion Metropolitan Group, Vermilion County Sheriff's Department and Hoopeston Police Department arrested three people after a drug raid at 512 E. Thompson. Jose Davila, 27, and Melba Sanchez, 44, both of Texas, and Juan Garcia, 27, of Mexico, were charged with cannabis tracking and unlawful possession of cannabis with the intent to deliver over 2,500 grams.

Police seized 540 pounds of what was believed to be marijuana at the home, with an estimated street value of more than \$1.8 million.

6) April's elections went smoothly for most offices, but not Hoopeston's Ward 3. There, neither Tony Hasbargen nor Susan Comstock, both of whom filed for the seat, were able to serve. Hasbargen withdrew because of a conflict with his seat on Hoopeston Public Library's board, while Comstock did not meet the residency requirement to file.

Comstock was later appointed to the seat by newlyelected Mayor Bill Crusinberry.

5) Rossville had a rip-roarin' good time in August during its sesquicentennial celebration, which included a



beard contest, parade and other activities.

- 4) Hoopeston officials, in an effort to save money, eliminated the position of economic developer in July. The position was paid for primarily through Tax Increment Financing funds. The city is also looking to save more money by ending its relationship with its TIF consultant and hiring a less expensive, as-needed representative.
- 3) Silgan Containers' announcement that the local plant would install a shearing machine, also meant the company would hire as many as six additional people. The machine allows the local plant to cut rolls of steel for can ends. The announcement was made in July and the shearer was delivered in September.
- 2) The Affordable Workforce Housing development was approved by the Hoopeston City Council in March, after preliminary work had been done for the project over the preceding two years. The project, which will be located on former Hoopeston Industrial Corporation ground, will include 25 single-family homes. Construction is expected to begin in 2010.
- 1) Hoopeston Regional Health Center was very visible in the area in 2009, from adding services, including diagnostics and Bridgeway, a senior citizens' mental health program; to inking an agreement with Carle Foundation Hospital in Urbana; and a \$4.6 million remodeling plan. In addition, HRCH sponsored free kids'
