A planned affordable workforce housing project is moving forward, while plans for a motel have stalled.

Mayor Bill Crusinberry, at Tuesday's Hoopeston

City Council meeting, told aldermen that a preliminary plat of the housing development was reviewed by engineer Ellen Hedrick, of Sodemann & Associ-



ates, and changes made on her recommendations. The plat will be put before the Hoopeston Plan Commission at 4 p.m. Monday. A special council meeting will be held at 7 p.m. Tuesday to vote on the commission's recommendation.

Developers must have the approved plat by January 15, Crusinberry said.

To be called Prairie Meadows, the development will consist of 25 single family homes and a park. It is set to be constructed on the former Hoopeston Industrial Corporation property on Route 9.

While that project is gearing up, plans for a motel have come to a standstill for financial reasons. Shailesh Patel, of Monticello, planned to build a motel at the corner of Routes 1 and 9. He planned to obtain a Small Business Administration loan but the SBA has tightened regulations due to the economy, leaving the motel project "as it has been, kind of in limbo," Crusinberry said.

In unrelated discussion, Crusinberry said ThyssenKrupp Presta of Danville is looking to h ire 20 to 25 skilled machine operators.
