Vermilion County Supervisor of Assessment Bill Kizer wants to remind all seniors that the Senior Citizens Assessment Freeze Homestead Exemption commonly known as the "Senior Assessment Freeze" deadline for filing is July 1, 2010.

The exemption is for property owners 65 or older in 2010 with household incomes of \$55,000 or less in 2009.

Kizer stated "As always our office is available to receive and notarize applications from 8 a.m.- 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday at the Courthouse Annex, and can be returned by mail as long as they are notarized."
