Special hammer marks half century in hardware business

Charles Pajor has a new hammer, but unlike most tools at Olympic Hardware, it's not for sale.

Pajor recently received an Estwing Gold Hammer Award, marking his 50th anniversary in the hardware business.

The hammer is gold-plated steel with a leather grip. Made in Rockford, it is mounted on a wooden plaque. "They did a good job," Pajor said. "They used my formal name: Charles M. Pajor."

Going by the award, Pajor would have started his career in 1960, but in fact, the 72-year-old Pajor said he has 62 years under his belt, starting in his father, Michael's, hardware store in Harvey.

That store opened in July 1934 and Pajor began working there as a youngster. He worked there full-time starting in 1955 when he graduated from high school, into 1974.

It was in 1974 that an armed robbery at the hard-ware store made Pajor decide to relocate. After looking at several spots, the family decided on Hoopeston and in 1975, Olympic Hardware was built in its current location on Route 1.

The business was a family venture with Pajor and his wife, Dorothy, and his sister and brother-in-law, Hal and JoAnn Turngren. In about 1990, the Turngrens left the business.

Now, Olympic Hardware is a multi-generational family business, with son Jim and wife Lori, as well as grandchildren, currently working there. "Out of 11 employees, only three aren't related," Pajor said.

Jim Pajor followed in his father's footsteps, working in the business while in school and full time when he graduated high school in 1978.

In 2000, Jim took over management of the store, and has expanded it, including adding a lumber department.

While no longer at the helm, Pajor still spends three days a week at the store, selling merchandise and visiting with people he has come to know in the community. He is also involved in community activities, such as the Hoopeston Lions Club and East Central Illinois Model Railroading.

His gold hammer is not the first in the family. His father also received a similar honor, which Pajor has, and he's looking forward to the day when Jim receives a similar honor.
