R-A, HA boards meet to discuss student residency issues

Rossville-Alvin and Hoopeston Area school boards met Thursday to discuss "not the world's most pleasant topic," said R-A board President Darren Duncan.

The issue is students who live in one district but attend school in the other and it has both boards concerned.

"I think it's been going on for a while," Duncan said. "I think it needs to be reined in and dealt with."

Regional Superintendent Mike Metzen, who is currently acting superintendent at Rossville-Alvin, provided information for both boards, telling them the matter "doesn't rest with you proving they're not residents, it's them proving they are."

There are several ways residents can prove their status, through providing mail or utility bills for their stated

address, a driver's license or signing an affidavit. However, owning land, a business or an unoccupied house does not prove residency, he added.

Metzen encouraged both boards to look at it as a money issue - where a district is not getting paid for a student for whom tuition should be paid.

Duncan agreed. "It's not necessarily fair to the home district taxpayers to be subsidizing their education," he said.

A district may charge up to 110 percent of the costs of educating a student.





Breaking the law is a class C misdemeanor, punishable by a \$1,500 fine or 30 days in jail, Metzen said.

Hoopeston Superintendent Hank Hornbeck said the situation works both ways and that instances should be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

Additionally, while some people break the law through ignorance, others "do this knowing it's not the kosher thing to do." He added he expects both districts will receive phone calls from those breaking the law.

Duncan advised caution in dealing with the problem. "You're messing with people and people's lives and you try to be very cautious about that," he said.

Duncan added that the Rossville-Alvin board was hesitant to address the issue in mid-year, but with registrations coming up, "this is an opportune time."

Duncan said he believes school code says resolution should start with superintendents, with board involvement only if resolution is not achieved.

HA board President Mark Wagoner concurred. "We, as a board, don't feel it's our job to police 1,400 kids," he said. "We've got more important things to do."
