Lack of quorum makes for no official city council meeting

Hoopeston City Council was unable to take any action at its meeting Tuesday, due to the lack of a quorum.

Only three members - Sue Comstock, Bill Goodwine and Brandon Hamilton - attended the meeting, causing Comstock to say she was "disappointed" in those who did not attend.

While no business was conducted, Mayor Bill Crusinberry reported that work on Prairie Meadows, an affordable workforce housing development, is coming along.

"I was reasonable impressed with the houses," he said, adding closets, bathrooms and utility rooms are bigger than he expected. While only a few of the houses will be handicapped accessible, all are adaptable, he said.

"I'm still cautiously optimistic this is going to be an asset to the city" Crusinberry said.

Of the first 13 houses to be built, leases have already been signed on 12, he said.

Crusinberry also noted that La Casa del Sol, a new Mexican restaurant, is officially open. Restaurant owners contacted the city about four months ago about opening an eatery here and "didn't request much of the city to open."

Also, Crusinberry noted that the former Witch School building on Main Street has been torn down.
