Alderman discusses pool maintenance, possible design change

With the swim season over, Alderman Carl Ankenbrand talked swimming pool issues at Tuesday night's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Ankenbrand asked the council to consider purchasing a spare pump for the pool to have on hand. Earlier this year, the pool pump broke, causing the pool to be closed for several days until a supplier found one at the high school in Anderson, Ind.

"My opinion is, if we're going to keep the pool open, it would be nice to have a backup pump so this doesn't happen again," he said.

The city also needs to replace the one borrowed from the school, Ankenbrand said.

Pump prices range from \$3,000 to \$6,500, depending on the model selected.

In related discussion, Ankenbrand asked the council to consider changing the kiddy pool to a splash pad area. A plus to the splash pad is no lifeguard is needed to monitor the area.

A proposed splash pad design grids a 40' x 35' area into areas for families, teens and toddlers, with directional water jets, spray loops, fountain sprays and other attractions.

tions, "with the economy the way it is, if we want to fund the pool as we have in the past."


