State, like residents, businesses, must rein in spending: Brady

Just as residents and businesses have had to rein in spending, so, too, should the state government, according to the Republican candidate for governor.

Bill Brady made a brief stop in Hoopeston Wednesday as part of his Clean Break Express campaign tour. After meeting with approximately 20 people who gathered to see him, Brady was interviewed live on WHPO by Larry Baughn.

Brady said if elected, he will bring the same restraint to government that residents and businesses have had to show. He promised to balance the state budget without raising taxes, saying the current economy is "probably in a worse recession since at any time since the Great De-

pression." He accused incumbent governor Patrick Quinn (D) of running up an \$8 billion deficit in two years.

Brady said the governor "needs to have the courage to make tough decisions" and "put the people of Illinois' interest ahead of special interest."

Aside from balancing the budget, Brady would also like to see a more hospitable business climate for all business, including agriculture. "Those Chicago guys forget agriculture is our #1 industry," he said, adding he would like to foster an environment more friendly to opportunities and provide a stable tax environment. "Businesses look for a competitive, level playing field,"

he said.

Brady would also like to see access to affordable health care for Illinois residents but doesn't favor the federal government's solution. Illinois, he said, could offer residents its own solution and maintain state's rights in the process.

Current polls put Brady nine points ahead of Quinn. Admitting the poll numbers are good, Brady downplayed their importance. "The only poll that matters is November 2," he said.

A business owner, Brady, of Bloomington, currently serves in the 44th district in the Illinois Senate.
