Weinard, Johnson defeat Dems for seats on county board

Grant Township will continue to be represented by Republicans - one new, one not.

Republicans four-term representative Gary Weinard and newcomer Todd Johnson were chosen as District 1 representatives to the Vermilion County Board, defeating Democrat challengers Danny Danner and Travis Taylor.

Johnson received 36.32 percent of the vote, with 1,420, followed by Weinard with 35.09 percent, at 1,372

Danner received 19.8 percent, with 774 votes and Taylor received 8.8 percent, with 344 votes.

At the county level, all incumbents save one kept their

Incumbent assessor Bill Kizer, appointed last Decem-

ber, lost to his Republican challenger, Matthew Long, 8.901 to 5.516.

Long-time county clerk Lynn Foster retained her seat in a close race with Republican challenger Dennis

In the race for Vermilion County sheriff, Republican incumbent Pat Hartshorn handily defeated Independent challenger Steve Swisher, 10,024 to 4,547.

Assessor Sue Stine ran unopposed and garnered 13,385 votes.

In state races, Incumbent Republican Shane Cultra will remain District 105 representative, after defeating Green Party's Vince LaMie..

Incumbent Attorney General Lisa Madigan retained her seat, as did Secretary of State Jesse White. Judy Baar Topinka was elected Comptroller.

> President Barack Obama's former Senate seat went to a Republican, as U.S. Rep. Mark Kirk eked by Democrat Alexi Giannoulias. Kirk garnered 48 percent of the vote, compared to Giannoulias' 46

> Former state Sen. Dan Rutherford carried Vermilion County and the state to become Illinois' next treasurer. In Vermilion County, Rutherford received 65.9 percent of the vote

For U.S. District 52 representative, incumbent Republican Tim Johnson again held off Democrat challenger David Gill.

In Illinois, the biggest race not decided Tuesday was that for governor. Wednesday morning, Democrat incumbent Pat
