Cornjerkers get green light for Liberty Bowl appearance

2011 will be a year of fundraising by the Hoopeston Area Marching Cornjerkers as they prepare for their December appearance at the Liberty Bowl.

The Hoopeston Area School Board on Thursday gave unanimous approval for the band to make the trip to Memphis.

Band director Wendy Ronna has come up with fundraising ideas, which may include a 5k run, playathon, and possibly pumping gas for tips, said high school Principal Larry Maynard. Also, letters will be send to area businesses and residents asking for contributions for the band's appearance.

The band needs to raise about \$30,000 - or \$500 per student - for the trip.

In unrelated business, the board reviewed a new Tri-Party Agreement, which governs responsibilities of Hoopeston Area, Rossville-Alvin and Bismarck-Henning districts for Rossville's high school students, who have attended school in the other districts since Rossville deactivated its high school in 2006.

Because Rossville-Alvin is considering reactivating its high school, the new agreement is for one year, rather than the two-year term of previous agreements.

Additionally, the new agreement calls for Ross-ville-Alvin to pay 100 percent of the average of Hoopeston Area and Bismarck-Henning tuition rates. For the past two years, Rossville has paid 95 percent of the average tuition.

What the new tuition rate will be will not be known until fall, said Superintendent Hank Hornbeck.

If none of the districts file written notice of intent not to renew by January 1, 2012, the one-year agreement will be extended for a second year.

Rossville-Alvin's board approved the contract at its January meeting, Hornbeck said. Hoopeston Area

and Bismarck-Henning boards will vote on it at their respective February meetings.

Currently, Rossville-Alvin pays tuition for 120 students. Of those, 54 attend Hoopeston Area.

Along with mulling over the agreement, the board is considering a request from Robin Lawson of Mr. B's Café, who asked permission to name a burger after the school mascot, the Cornjerker.

Lawson told the board the idea came to her after members of the basketball team were in the restaurant. She said she would like to name the burger "in honor of the students" and will get student input on what should be on the burger so that it will be "something that the kids will eat."

Hoopeston Area Sports Boosters approved the idea prior to Thursday night, Lawson said, adding if the board declines her request, she will not be upset. "I can name it something else," she said. "I don't want any trouble."

In other business, the board:

- Approved resignations of Brianne Dilbeck, fifth grade teacher, effective January 21.
- Approved retirements of Theresa Meyer, John Greer Title 1, effective at the end of the school year, and Betty Richards, superintendent secretary, effective September 30.
- Approved Hornbeck as secondary Freedom of Information Act officer. Rosellen Cornelius is the primary officer.
- Hornbeck also said the district is looking to purchase iPads or netbooks for board members as a means of keeping communication between the district and board FOIA compliant.
- Approved the 105-member seniority list.
- Approved the board/administration retreat for February 5.


