HA student wins Creativity Award for *I Sing the Body Electric*

High school artists, writers, poets, and actors throughout Vermilion County presented their health based art projects to nearly 200 people at the eighth *I Sing the Body Electric* Arts and Health Festival held May 1 at Danville Area Community College.

Students worked individually or in groups to create 77 projects that addressed the serious health issues of alcohol and drug use, depression, body image, violence, and sexuality behavior.

Zach Lewallen of Hoopeston Area High School won a Creativity Award for "Stop! Drugs Aren't Cool."

Other winners from Hoopeston Area include Gabrielle

Carter, Grand Merit; Cory Coffman, Merit; Danielle Harrison, Merit; Lauren Houmes, Tyler Rush, Mara Sutton and Shayne VonBehren, Merit; Samantha Vaughn, Grand Merit; and Gina Werkheiser, Grand Merit.

In all, seven projects received Grand Merit honors; 34 received Merit and 19 Honorable Mention.


