City council approves nearly \$100,000 in street projects

Streets throughout Hoopeston will get a facelift under the 2011-12 Motor Fuel Tax program.

Ribbe Trucking submitted the only bid for the work. The \$99,998.28 bid was higher than the \$95,360 engineer's estimate, but is within the five percent tolerance level, said Alderman Randy Carter, street/alley committee chairman.

Areas that will receive BAM and seal coat include the entrance of Parkview Court and the post office alley. Prime and seal coat will be placed on Penn east of Euclid and the parking lot at the city maintenance building.

Streets to be seal coated include College Way from Main to Penn; Third Ave. from Main to Penn and Orange to Washington; Chestnut from Sixth Ave. to Fifth Ave., Third Ave. to Second Ave., and Sixth St. to Seventh St.; Sixth St. from Orange to Chestnut; Seventh St. from Thompson to McNeil; Fifth St., from Thompson to Wyman; Fourth St. From Thompson to Wyman; and Wyman from Seventh St. to Fifth St. and Fifth St. to Market.

Carter said there is a sense of urgency to get the projects going so they may be completed before Labor Day.

In other business, Alderwoman Sue Comstock told the council she will expect a vote on the façade program at the next meeting.

Under the program, 50-50 grants (up to \$5,000) are available to business owners to update the façades of their storefronts.

Some businesses applied for the program last year but did not receive a response from the city, Comstock said. One of those, Pizza King, submitted an application but received no response. Owners invested about \$5,000 in updating their façade, she said, adding she would like to see the company get a "stipend payment" for their efforts. "That's just something I'll throw out there now

and we'll discuss it next time," she said.

In unrelated business, the council:

- Heard from Alderman Carl Ankenbrand, parks committee chairman. "I would like to ask citizens, please don't trash our parks," he said.
- Approved the employee wage ordinance, which gives city workers a 30 cent per hour raise. That does not apply to the police department which has a union contract.
- Heard from Mayor Crusinberry about forms available at city hall which will allow residents to submit possible sites for Vermilion County Health Department's brownfields grant.
