School board looks at ways to make ag program successful

Hoopeston Area's school board is considering ways to assure the success of its agriculture program.

In February, the board approved having the program at Hoopeston Area. It had currently been offered at the former Rossville-Alvin High School.

While classroom space was easily available, board members said a shop area is also needed. One option is to turn the existing bus maintenance area into the ag shop and build a separate building for bus maintenance, said building and grounds committee chairman Mark Schaumburg.

Another option may be to erect a building to house the

area, said board President Russ Walder.

Member Chris Elliott said none of the current options "fit the bill, so to speak," adding the board "has a long way to go, but we will get there."

Firm numbers on either a stand-alone bus maintenance area or combined administration/bus area were not available, but all board members seemed to agree more space is needed to ensure the ag program's success.

"We'd like to see the ag program take root and be something we can be proud of," Schaumburg said, adding the board has "full confidence" in ag instructor Emily McCray.

Having a shop area is something we really need to look at strongly. It will be an expense that will need to be talked about."

transportation at 57 percent, decreased to 50 percent this year, said Superintendent Hank Hornbeck.

In total, the tentative budget will deduct \$1.7 million from district surplus funds with the education fund showing a negative \$1.08 million; building negative \$634,000; and transportation, negative \$133,000.

The deficits will still leave the district with surpluses in each of its eight funds.

"It's been a tradition in our school district to always look at a worst case scenario," Hornbeck said.

In unrelated action, the board:

- Approved resignations from Heather Ohlemeyer, Honeywell special education; Patricia McNeely, high school personal aide (VASE); and Ann Penicook, curriculum coordinator/external PBIS coach, who accepted a position with the Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports program.
