Request to clean property turns into enforcement debate

A request from a resident to have an owner clean up property turned into a discussion on how ordinances should be enforced.

Resident Ollie Oakley, who was at the September 6 Hoopeston City Council meeting to complain about property near his home, was at Tuesday night's meeting about the same issue.

Alderwoman Susan Comstock said she went to the property in question at Chestnut and Sixth, and said problems were being corrected. "They've complied as far as they've been told," she said.

Oakley complained about a 12' privet hedge, calling it an eyesore, and read the city's derelict vehicles ordinance, which states unlicensed vehicles have to be under a hard cover, not tarps or similar covers. He said a motor home, camper and two-wheeled vehicle are in the back yard, in violation of the ordinance.

Comstock responded that the only way anyone could know about the vehicles is to peek through openings in the fence.

"That don't make no difference," Oakley said, about how he viewed the vehicles. "I'm not going to give up on this."

Comstock said the issue could "open a can of worms" as other people are violating other ordinances, such as living in campers and raising chickens.

However, Alderman Bill Goodwine said that while some violations may not be noticed, those called to the city's attention by citizens should be dealt with.

Alderman Brandon Hamilton said everyone should help compliance officer John Holt find violations and suggested Comstock "pass that information on to Mr. Holt."

City attorney Scott Perkins said the council should meet with Holt and the dog catcher to discuss enforcement, saying there should not be "spot enforcement."

Comstock said it seems some residents are singled out for violations, saying the property owners in question were cited at least twice in two weeks.

In unrelated business, the council:

Heard from Hamilton, fire committee chairman, that the department is looking to purchase two pieces of equipment with accrued funds.

Heard from Mayor Bill Crusinberry that Motor Fuel funds cannot be used to repair roads at Floral Hill Cemetery. "Come budget time, we're going to have to dig a little deeper," he said. "Some really need to be fixed."
