Crusinberry re-elected, Queen gets nod as Rossville mayor

Hoopeston's mayor will retain his seat, while Rossville will have a new leader, in races with percentages often seen in single-candidate elections.

Bill Crusinberry easily defeated challenger Jeramy Dobkins to remain as Hoopeston's top elected official.

In official results, Crusinberry received 696 votes to Dobkins' 204. The 900 vote total count is

about 25 percent of registered voters.

In the only other race in the city, incumbent Alderman Carl Ankenbrand handily defeated challenger Charles Strawser, 118-43.

In Rossville, where six-term mayor Terry Prillaman opted not to run, Richard Queen was the top vote-getter, defeating fellow trustee Nancy Null, 304-54.

In a five-person race for three seats on the Rossville Village board, top vote getters were Jon Scott Sprague, 274; Jim Smith, 260; and Ann Stone, 221. Other candidates were Shawn M. Cade with 118 votes and Justin Richison with 64.

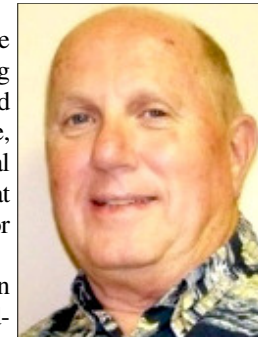
By a wide margin, Rossville voters approved allowing Rossville-Alvin School Board members to be elected at large, rather than by congressional township. The vote in that referendum was 296 in favor and 159 against.

Voters in several Vermilion County municipalities, including Hoopeston and Rossville, approved electric aggregation.

In Hoopeston, the vote was 529-305, while in Rossville, 216 voted for and 122 against. The measures allow governing bodies to make agreements with companies to provide electrical service to residents and small commercial companies at lower rates than Ameren's.

Residents who do not wish to participate must opt out of the program.

In the Danville Area Community College trustee race, Ron Serfoss and Greg Wolfe won with 6,827 and 5,608, respectively. A third candidate, Harry Brockus, received 3,348 votes. Total do not include Iroquois County votes.
