• Households with a member receiving social security disability benefits or with a pending determination case at the Social Security Administration. Required documentation includes a letter of determination from the Social Security Administration or receipt of social secu-

rity disability benefit statement.

Households with children under 60 months (5 years) of age or younger. A birth certificate will be required.
Households that contain a member with a medical condition that can be improved by air conditioning, such as asthma, emphysema, coronary disease and terminal illnesses. Required documentation must include a doctor's certification letter dated within the last 90 days, stating that the medical condition would be aggravated by extreme heat.

In addition, customers must bring the following:

•Social security cards and proof of income for the last 30 days for all household members;

•A copy of their most recent electric bill; and Because of the shortness of the program, no pending applications will be taken. Customers must bring all documentation with them.

Customers are assisted based on the availability of funds and income eligibility. Community Action will specifically serve all households who meet income guidelines.

Customers currently enrolled in the PIPP Program are ineligible for the Summer Cooling Benefits.
