County mental health board holds training to aid youth

The Vermilion County Mental Health Board is sponsoring a free training on Mental Health First Aid, a new curriculum focused on helping youth who may be experiencing a mental health challenge or in a crisis. Training will be from 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m. July 20 at Danville Township Town Hall, 101 W. North Street Danville.

Training is being offered as a part of a grant through the Illinois Children's Mental Health Partnership and will cover eight hours of instruction and a free 211 page training manual.

Youth Mental Health First Aid is a public education program which introduces participants to risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems in adolescents; builds understanding of the importance of early intervention; and most importantly, teaches individuals how to help a youth who is in crisis or experiencing a mental health or substance use challenge.

Mental Health First Aid uses role-playing and simulations to demonstrate how to assess a mental health crisis; select interventions and provide initial help; and connect young people to professional, peer, social, and self-help care.

The course teaches participants the risk factors and warning signs of a variety of mental health challenges

common among adolescents, including anxiety, depression, psychosis, eating disorders, AD/HD, disruptive behavior disorders, and substance use disorder. Participants do not learn to diagnose nor how to provide any therapy or counseling – rather, participants learn a core five-step action plan to support an adolescent developing signs and symptoms of mental illness or in an emotional crisis:

- Assess for risk of suicide or harm
- •Listen non-judgmentally
- •Give reassurance and information






