Ryan Nosler, 18, of Hoopeston, charged with illegal consumption of alcohol by a minor. He was released on a notice to appear.


Andrew Cordova, 18, of Mendota, charged with possession of cannabis and possession of drug paraphernalia and released on \$100 bond.
