Medical center, high school to work at combating STD

Hoopeston Area High School and Carle Hoopeston Regional Health Center are partnering to combat an increase in the rate of sexually transmitted diseases.

At Thursday's Hoopeston Area board meeting Misti Runge, RN and Connie Catron, NP, spoke about the need to give young people information to make choices that will protect them from STDs.

According to Runge, who oversees CHRHC's infection control practices, Vermilion County has one of the highest rates in the state and Illinois ranks sixth nationally among states with the highest rates.

Reported cases of chlamydia and gonorrhea have risen

markedly, Runge said. Chlamydia cases jumped from 438 to 602 and gonorrhea reports are at 154, up from 82. "The numbers keep going up," she said.

Catron and Jason Shaver, PA-C, will present information to students in their physical education classes. The information will encourage abstinence - the only sure way to avoid STDs - but will also include information on safe sex, Catron said.

Principal Larry Maynard said that while the school teaches students about sex and STDs, "in view of the statistics, maybe we need to stress the consequences."
