National Ag Statistics Service sets final 2013 state figures

The National Agricultural Statistics Service released its final 2013 crop production figures recently. Illinois harvested a nation-leading 462 million bushels of soybeans and 2.1 billion bushels of corn, which ranked second behind Iowa.

Summary information on crops include:

Corn: Planted area, at 12.0 million acres, is down 6 percent from 2012. Harvested area, at 11.8 million acres, is down four percent from the previous year. The corn yield is estimated at 178 bushels per acre, up 73 bushels from 2012. Production is estimated at 2.10 billion bushels, 63 percent above the previous year. This represents the third highest yield and production total on record.

Soybeans: Planted area, at 9.45 million acres, is up four percent from 2012. Harvested area, at 9.42 million acres, is up five percent from the previous year. The soybean yield is estimated at 49 bushels per acre, up six bushels from 2012 and the third highest yield on record. Production is estimated at 462 million bushels, 20 percent above the previous year. Illinois was the largest soybean producer in the nation in 2013.

Sorghum: Planted area, at 23,000 acres, is down 23 percent from 2012. Harvested area, at 20,000 acres, is down 26 percent from the previous year. The sorghum yield is estimated at 94 bushels per acre, up 34 bushels from last year. Production is estimated at 1.88 million bushels, 16 percent above the previous year.

Winter wheat: Harvested area in 2013, at 830,000 acres, is up 29 percent from the previous year. The winter wheat yield is estimated at 67 bushels per acre, up 4 bushels from 2012. Production is estimated at 55.6 million bushels, 37 percent above the previous year.

Oats: Harvested area in 2013, at 25,000 acres, is up 25 percent from the previous year. The oat yield is estimated at 69 bushels per acre, down 7 bushels from 2012. Production is estimated at 1.73 million bushels, 13 percent above the previous year.

All hay: Harvested area, at 660,000 acres, is up 14 percent from 2012. The all hay yield is estimated at 3.1 tons per acre, up 0.5 ton from the previous year. Production is estimated at 2.02 million tons, 36 percent above

Summer potatoes: Planted area, at 6,800 acres, is down 11 percent from 2012. Harvested area, at 6,700 acres, is down 9 percent from the previous year. The summer potato yield is estimated at 370 cwt per acre, down 10 cwt from 2012. Production is estimated at 2.48 million cwt, 12 percent below the previous year.
