Concealed carry applications get once over by local police

People who have applied for concealed carry permits in Illinois can expect those applications to be reviewed by local police.

According to the law, approved last July, Illinois State Police, in charge of issuing concealed carry permits, has 90 days from receipt of the application to grant permission or not. Thirty of those days may be used up by local police departments, which may object to an application.

According to an interactive map for applications, 274 applications have been submitted by Vermilion County residents. Of those, three received objections from Hoopeston Police Department.

The website lists objections by local municipal police and sheriff's departments in each county. Vermilion County Sheriff's Department has issued no objections.

Three objections don't seem like many; however in Chicago, only seven objections were filed on 7,974 applications.

Hoopeston Police Chief Mark Drollinger said the numbers indicate that local police have more personal dealings with its citizens than police in places like Chicago. "I think the City of Chicago has such a

low number because they don't have personal contact and know the applicants like we do," he said.
