Man pleads guilty for second time to wife's 2005 murder

A Hoopeston man will return to prison after pleading guilty again to the 2005 death of his wife.

Steven Miller, 39, pleaded guilty in January 2006 to one count of first degree murder in the shooting death of his wife, Eva R. Miller, on September 5, 2005. He was originally sentenced to 35 years in the Department of Corrections.

However, the Fourth Appellate Court reversed the plea in December 2012, granting Miller a new trial. On March 22, 2013, Miller was allowed to withdraw his guilty plea.

Tuesday, Miller pleaded guilty in Vermilion County Circuit Court to one count of second degree murder and one count of aggravated battery. He was sentenced to 20 and 25 years in prison, respectively, with sentences to run concurrently and with credit for the eight years, five months and 13 days served from September 5, 2005 to February 17, 2014.

Miller's appeal and subsequent appellate court decision stemmed from a difference between facts presented at the first trial by Larry Mills, then-assistant state's attorney, and the terms of the original plea agreement.

Miller's plea to an amended first degree murder charge did not stipulate the use of a gun, although Mills

According to reports, on the night of the murder, police were called at 10:04 p.m. to the Miller home in the 200 block of West Lincoln. Miller first claimed his wife committed suicide. He later recanted that statement.

At the first trial, Mills said Miller believed his wife was having an affair with a coworker. The couple, who had a history of domestic violence, argued and Miller went upstairs where he got a .380 pistol. He returned downstairs, confronted Mrs. Miller, then pointed the gun at her from two to three feet away. Mills said as she
