## Local, county citizens' votes different than state counterparts

November races would be much different if voters statewide had cast ballots similar to those cast in Grant Township.

In unofficial results, incumbent Gov. Pat Quinn received 71.8 of the vote, handily defeating Democrat challenger Tio Hardiman.

Quinn will face Republican winner Bruce Rauner, who defeated nearest competitor Kirk Dillard, 40.1 percent to 37.3 percent.

Quinn lost among local voters, getting 46 total votes in Grant wards, compared to Hardiman's 51. He also lost among county voters, with 615 votes to Hardiman's

773

Rauner also lost in local voting, in third place behind the frontrunner, Dillard, with 173 and Dan Rutherford with 123. Bill Brady, who ran against Quinn in the last gubernatorial race, came in last with 81 votes.

Rauner was not the lead vote-getting in the county. His 1,145 votes put him second to Dillard, with 1,577. County-wide, Brady picked up 675 votes and Rutherford trailed with 516.

County totals exclude Danville.

## Hoopeston Area, Schlarman to co-op football for two years

Hoopeston Area will host Schlarman Academy of Danville in a two-year football co-op starting next year.

Hoopeston Area School Board approved the agreement at Tuesday's monthly meeting.

Hoopeston Area will take the lead in the co-op. HA head coach Michl Kearney will retain that post, with an assistant coach provided by Schlarman, said Kevin Root, district athletic director.

The Schlarman coach will bus athletes to Hoopeston for practice and for the first year, two home games will be held in Danville and three at Hoopeston, allowing both schools to have a senior night and homecoming. The second year, Schlarman will host one home game with the remainder in Hoopeston, Root said.

The combined team will have new jerseys but will still be Hoopeston Area Cornjerkers, said Root.

HA's marching band will play at all games in Hoopeston and Danville and local cheerleaders will cheer at Hoopeston-based games and take turns with their Schlarman counterparts by quarters, in Danville, said Supt. Hank Hornbeck.

Two years ago, Schlarman started its football season but quit after a few games. Last year, the school did not field a team.

Next year, Schlarman officials are estimating that about 20 athletes will play football, while Hoopeston Area will have about 30, Root said. With that many players, officials hope to get a JV schedule, as well, he added.

In other business, the board heard from officials about whether a "no pass/no play" policy is needed in the district.

Such a plan was approved in 2012 as part of the high school restructuring plan. It was to begin in 2014, with weekly eligibility checks starting in the 2013-14 year.

No Pass, No Play was delayed to allow implementation of the ASAP (After School Assistance Program). Any athlete failing a class must attend ASAP to work on bringing the grade up.

ASAP's success has officials wondering now if No Pass, No Play is even needed.

"The model we have now is working pretty well," said high school principal Larry Maynard, adding that a decision needs to be made whether to maintain the current level or "move to a stronger level."

Suzi Root, Response to Intervention coordinator, told the board that ASAP meets after school on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Teachers and National Honor Society members tutor athletes, which also includes cheerleaders and team managers.

Citing winter sports statistics, Root said 28 percent of winter athletes attended at least once during the 10-week session. Of those athletes, 70 percent did not have to return and four had to attend for only one week.

Board president Russell Walder said he had heard differing opinions on the No Pass, No Play. One school of thought said student would step up to the bar, while the other was that the policy would eliminate students who are already at a disadvantage.

Maynard said the school's restructuring committee felt strongly about the policy but that officials must also look at how programs could be affected by small district with small participation numbers.

Also, he said, the policy may have a negative effect on youth athletes. He said ninth grade is the most difficult and that if a student in transition fails a test or paper, "he wont' regain his footing until three weeks later" under No Pass, No Play.

Kevin Root added that the school is trying to add more honors courses and that No Pass/No Play might discourage students from taking those classes and possibly failing.
