### Aldermen split, mayor breaks tie to keep license numbers

A 4-4 tie on a vote to increase the number of licenses allowing businesses to sell packaged liquor was broken when Hoopeston Mayor Bill Crusinberry voted against the increase Tuesday night.

The vote was the same as one taken in October when aldermen Joe Fell, Carl Ankenbrand, Randy Carter and Bill McElhaney voted in favor of the increase and Brandon Hamilton, Bill Goodwine, Nancy Stipp and Larry Baughn voted against it.

Crusinberry opted not to break that tie, saying to do so would rewrite the ordinance. Tuesday night, he prefaced his vote by saying if the ordinance is to be changed, he wants a concensus from the council. Also, he said, when someone purchases a business that sells alcohol, they know who their competitors are, based on the number of licenses in each class.

The 5-4 defeat of the measure means Hoopeston Marathon will not get a requested license for hard liquor. Manager Sunny Singh has requested the license for several months. In March, resident Steve Bane presented a petition to the council with more than 600 signatures that asked the council to grant Singh's request.

big project - resurfacing Thompson Avenue - which is slated for 2017, she said.

In other discussion, Mike Streff of Foth Environmental and Infrastructure, updated the council on work on the ground and aerial water storage tanks and sand filters

One of the city's three sand filters is offline and a sample has been taken and sent to a state laboratory to test for radium 226 and radium 228, he said. Results are slow in coming, possibly because only two labs in the state do such testing.

Officials have previously said that filters being offline will result in more rust in the water system.

The council also unanimously passed the 2014-15 budget, with a surplus of \$2,540. The budget gives employees a two percent raise and includes one-time expenses of \$20,000 for a housing feasibility study and \$25,000 for Christmas lights at McFerren Park.
