County clerk asks schools help in finding election judges

Vermilion County Clerk Lynn Foster had a nefarious reason for coming to Thursday's Hoopeston Area School Board meeting.

She started her visit pleasantly enough, telling the board about changes in school board elections, the discrepancies of which have not yet all been worked out.

She also told the board she appreciated that the district signed off on a geographic information system (GIS) map of the district. Then she got to the point. "My evil plan tonight in coming up here is an issue I have...and that is securing election judges," Foster said. Despite doing much outreach, Vermilion County needs more election judges who are willing to take the training and commit to at least three elections.

To make the task more appealing, Foster received a grant to make training available online by the end of June or early July. "I'm hoping that will help us attract
