Bennett gets nod to replace Harms as GOP rep nominee

A man who ran against Josh Harms to represent the 106th district has been selected to replace him.

Representatives of each county in the district - which includes Vermilion, Ford, Iroquois, Livingston and Woodford counties - met Sunday to pick a replacement for Harms, who announced in June that he would not seek re-election because of family concerns.

Bennett, who works at State Farm Insurance in Bloomington, is chairman of the Park-

land College Board of Trustees and heads the Ford County Republican party, was one of five candidates in the 2012 primary to represent the 106th. He came in second to Harms, with 28 percent of the vote, compared to Harms' 33 percent.

Other contenders to replace Harms were former state Sen. Shane Cultra, of Onarga; Michael Mercier and Susan Wynne Bence, of Watseka; and Jason Bunting of rural Cabery.
