University of Illinois Extension and the Vermilion County Master Gardeners will hold another installment of the Tuesday Night Classes, this time on extending the growing season of plants. "Season Extenders – Greenhouses and Coldframes" will take place at 6:30 p.m. on November 11 at Crossroads Christian Church, Danville.

Hobby greenhouses, cold frames and hoop houses are all ways to extend the growing season in Illinois and they are just some of the techniques to be discussed at the class.
