## Water work continues, testing shows far less iron in water

A second sand filter is now online, helping clean Hoopeston water, while a third is set to be updated and returned to service.

The second filter returned to service Friday, after it had been cleaned, refilled, backwashed and tested, said engineer Mike Streff, of Farnsworth Group, at Monday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

The third filter, which is currently out of service for repairs, was opened Monday. "It was pretty bad, wasn't it," Streff asked Steve Baker, water superintendent.

"It was real bad," Baker responded.

Testing on iron in the water, which causes the rust that residents have complained about for years, showed .1 milligrams/liter, Baker said. Iron levels had been 1.2 to 1.3, sometimes close to 1.5 milligrams per liter.

Despite the much lower readings, Baker said rust is still in the system and will probably remain there until the city's hydrant flushing program starts in the spring.

Work on the water tower continues, with about 75 percent of sandblasting and priming done on both the interior and exterior, Streff said.

In related discussion, Alderman Bill McElhaney, water/ sewer committee chairman, said an old civil defense siren that had been on the water tower has been taken down and cleaned up. A remote will be added to it and it will be put back on the tower at the 150' level so that it can be used for emergencies and "heard all over town," he said.

In unrelated business, the council accepted a bid from Flower and Herb FARMacy, of rural Hoopeston, for grave blankets. The city will pay \$44.75 each for 39 blankets in its perpetual care program.
