Early cold snap causes delay in water tower refurbishment

Freezing temperatures have caused delays in work on Hoopeston's water tower.

At Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, Mike Streff, of Farnsworth Group, said work inside the tower's bowl was suspended until heating and dehumidifying equipment was delivered and placed in the bowl.

Additionally, three pressure tanks located throughout Hoopeston were temporarily winterized with thermal blankets to keep connections from freezing.

The tanks are providing water pressure for customers while the elevated tank is empty for repairs and repainting.

Under terms of the contract between Leander Construction and the city, "significant work" is to be completed on repairing both the ground and aerial storage tanks by January 25, 2015, but continued cold could be a problem. "Forty to 50 degree temperatures would be nice," Streff said.

In related discussion, Streff told the council that the final sand filter is being updated and is expected to be back online before Christmas.

Approximately 20,000 lbs. of sand has been taken from Hoopeston's water system and is expected to be used on city streets this winter, said Bill McElhaney, water/sewer committee chairman.

Sand is expected to be used to help stretch the city's supply of road salt.

In unrelated business, the council:

• Heard from Karon Gibson, bus driver for a preschool program at First Christian Church, 502 E. Main, who said drivers are passing her stopped bus when children are getting on and off the bus. Gibson said motorists ignoring the "stop" arm on the bus is endangering three- to five-year-old children, espe-
