HA students to make complex machine for simple task

Hoopeston Area High School science students will take a simple task - cleaning a blackboard - and make a complex machine to perform it.

That's the goal of the Rube Goldberg Machine Contest, which will be held March 13 at the University of Illinois.

Adam Elliott, high school general science teacher, plans to take a team of 12 students to the contest, named after a cartoonist best known for his crazy chain reaction inventions.

The assigned task is to clean a blackboard and Elliott's team must design a machine to do just that, using no fewer than 20 steps. As a twist, Elliott told the board that the students' design will include stationary wipers with a moving blackboard.

This is the second year Elliott's students have participated in the contest. This year's team includes "not traditionally strong science students," he said, adding that other skills, such as fabricating and building, are also necessary for good projects.

Elliott said he and chemistry and physics teacher Jared Moraska could "turn out a fantastic machine with our knowledge," but that their job is to facilitate creative thinking among students. The contest will "provide a lot of opportunities and it's a lot of fun," he said.

A second contest, the Purdue Bridge Bust, will encourage HA science students to build a balsa wood bridge that is lightweight, sturdy and aesthetically pleasing. In this contest, to be held March 6, the bridge which weighs the least, holds the most, and is judged goodlooking, wins.

In related science discussion, Principal Anne Burton said the middle school plans to add a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) lab. She hopes the lab, to be located in the former home ec room, will include a 3D printer, and other enticements. "We want this lab to be something everybody in the building can use," she said.
