Requested change order dies without a second at meeting

A request for a change order to work on Hoopeston's water system that would have included sandblasting and painting piping, pumps and more at the water plant failed to make it to a vote at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Alderman Bill McElhaney, water/sewer committee chairman, made a motion to do the work but the motion failed to get a second, killing it.

Instead, officials will go out for bids on the work.

Engineer Mike Streff, of Farmsworth Group, explained that using a change order would allow the project to be done more quickly. Pipes at the plant are currently covered in lead paint, which will have to be sand blasted and repainted. Pumps, motors and the floor of the water treatment plant would also be painted.

Streff said now would be a good time to do the work because low humidity would allow the new coating to dry quickly.

Cost of the work was to be \$74,169.65, McElhaney said.

However, Alderman Bill Goodwine, finance committee chairman, said a cheaper price might be had by bidding. "Why not have a competitive bid rather

than a noncompetitive quote," he asked.

Asked by Mayor Bill Crusinberry how long it would take to assemble bidding documents. Streff said that would take about two weeks, followed by publishing a bid notice and then the bid opening, putting actual work off by about two months.

"It needs to be done but it's not critical," Streff said, adding "now is a good time to do it, climatewise."

In related discussion, Streff said the aerial water storage tank is back on line and functioning well. "I can sleep at night knowing the elevated water storage tank is back online," he said. "Steve Baker (water superintendent) is sleeping better, too.

While the water tower was empty, three hydropneumatic tanks were located throughout Hoopeston to provide pressure for the water system. It was a race against the clock to get the tower repaired, recoated, cured and refilled before water in the pressure tanks froze in the cold weather.

With the aerial storage tank online, the pressure tanks have been emptied and winterized and will remain where they are. In the spring, they will be put back in service when the water tower is again emptied so the exterior can be painted.

In other business, Crusinberry said he has received comments and letters of appreciation about Christmas lights in McFerren Park. He related that Chad Thomas, whose house across from the park was decorated for Christmas, talked with visitors who came from Champaign, Rantoul, Lafayette and other places.

Crusinberry also commended Hoopeston Area High School's Marching Cornjerkers for receiving three trophies at the Peach Bowl on December 31 in Atlanta.
