Mayor chooses after council splits on water building paint

Hoopeston City Council members split on whether to paint the interior of the water treatment building at Tuesday's meeting.

In suggesting the work be done, Alderman Bill McElhaney said Leander Construction, in charge of the water tower project, lowered its original offer of \$79,169.65 to \$63,84774 to paint pipes, pumps motors and the floor after existing lead-based paint is blasted from the surfaces.

Alderman Bill Goodwine, questioning the need to spend so much when neither state law nor EPA regulations require the removal of lead-based paint in such buildings, suggested spending \$500 for "a bucket of paint and a brush" would do just as well.

Goodwine said lead paint does not become an issue as it is. "You create a hazard by blasting it away," he said.

McElhaney did not disagree with Goodwine's points, but said water Superintendent Steve Baker requested the work be done. "He doesn't really ask for things," he said.

Alderman Larry Baughn asked why, in the space of a couple weeks, the cost dropped. "It was alright to try to get \$79 (thousand) from us," he asked.

Alderman Randy Carter said the water building should not be "out of sight, out of mind" and said while he saw both sides, he had to ask himself "if it were my house, would I fix it or would I band aid it?"

After the council voted 7-1 to waive bids on the work - with Goodwine being the only no vote - McElhaney made a second motion to have the work done for the lowered cost. Alderwoman Nancy Stipp cast the first no vote, followed by aldermen Joe Fell, Baughn, and Goodwine

Mayor Bill Crusinberry broke the tie, voting with the ayes, saying his desire, when he leaves the mayor's chair, is to leave the city's infrastructure in better shape than he found it.

Engineer Mike Streff, with Farnsworth Group, explained that when the work is done, both the sandblasted paint and blasting materials must be disposed of in ways that meet EPA regulations. "Chain of command" must be maintained when the debris is containerized, shipped and disposed of, he said.

In related discussion, McElhaney said water department personnel are currently manning the water plant 24 hours a day until the new ground storage tank is online, because the old ground storage tank has been taken off-line for repairs.
