His example that good citizenships leads to a strong community.

Henson, 83, began his coaching career in 1958 at Las Cruces High School, Las Cruces, New Mexico, where, as head coach for four years, he led his team to state championships in 1959, 1960 and 1961.

His college coaching career began in 1962 at Hardin-Simmons University. In 1966, he took over at his alma mater, New Mexico State University, where the Aggies rebounded from a 4-22 record the prior season to 15-11. In 1970, he led the Aggies to their only trip to the Final Four.

In 1975, Henson moved to the University of Illinois, leading the Illini to the Final Four in 1989. In 21 years at Illinois, he garnered 423 wins and 224 losses, with a record of 214 wins and 164 losses in Big Ten Conference games.

In 1997, Henson was named interim head coach at New Mexico State, then was named head coach until his retirement in midseason 2004-05, for health reasons.
