Milford man held on \$1 million

A Milford man is being held on \$1 million bond in connection with the beating death of another Milford man last week.

Danny R. Murphy, 52, remains jailed on two counts of first degree murder in the death of David C. Garrett, 48.

According to published reports, Murphy caused fatal injuries to Mr. Garrett during an altercation at a Milford home Tuesday evening. Murphy is alleged to have beaten Mr. Garrett in the head and face, causing his death.

Mr. Garrett was taken to Iroquois Memorials Hospital, Watseka, and was transferred to Carle Foundation Hospital, Urbana, where he died Wednesday. An autopsy determined he died from blunt force trauma.

Murphy, who was on parole for robbery and false impersonation of a police officer, is expected back in court on April 14.

Iroquois County Sheriff's Department and Milford police are continuing to investigate the incident.
