Barickman: 'exciting' time in state government as Rauner pushes legislation on workers' comp, term limits, tort, tax reform

This is an exciting time in state government. Governor Bruce Rauner has released five proposals for much-needed reforms to our state. He has been talking about his ambitious Turnaround Agenda for quite a while now. He set up meetings with leaders from both parties to negotiate real compromises.

One of the first rule of politics is that it is rare for any one individual or side to get everything they want. That is certainly true with Rauner's new legislation. But the new bills represent true compromises to repair many of the most outdated and broken elements of Illinois law.

Everyone from the business community to employees realizes our workers' comp system needs serious changes. A few years ago, we passed a bill offering small changes that moved us in the right direction, but it wasn't enough. We have the seventh-highest cost for workers' comp insurance in the nation. There is no excuse for this. These costs are one of the top reasons given when businesses choose to locate in other states. Rauner's proposal will change that and help bring more jobs to our struggling state.



Other proposals deal with term limits and redistricting. Term limits are fairly self-explanatory, and Illinois residents have repeatedly shown this is a reform they want, including a strong show of



support for a November referendum that passed overwhelmingly. The Governor's proposed redistricting

reform would finally put an end to the incredibly partisan gerrymandering that has become standard practice in Illinois, creating legislative districts drawn purely for the most political gain, instead of districts that

Rauner's legislative package also includes tort reform, which would help put an end to frivolous lawsuits. The last measure would create a much needed property tax

freeze to help hard-working homeowners who are getting crushed under ever-increasing rates.

The Governor hasn't moved forward on other plans, including right-to-work proposals. He has focused like a laser on real compromise reforms that include the concerns of those on all sides.

These bills deserve to move forward. The time is now to take concrete action to turn our state around. There will still be challenges to turn these common-sense reforms into law. Many entrenched interests have gotten rich off of the status quo, and they will fight to keep their wallets fat at the taxpayers' expense. But these proposals offer a chance for the citizens to take their state back.
