

McFadden added to board; Chromebook program ramps up

Hoopeston Area School Board welcomed a new member Thursday night.

Dave McFadden, owner of Anthem Chevrolet-Buick, was sated at Thursday's regular meeting. He was one of three people who submitted a letter of interest in the position vacated by Stewart Coffman's resignation, said board President Russell Walder. All were interviewed by the board Monday, with McFadden being selected.

Walder said the board was "very pleased with all the candidates but could only select one." The other two

were encouraged to perhaps seek a future board seat, he said.

Walder thanked Coffman, who resigned for personal reasons, and his family, "for all the hours they have given to the district."

In unrelated business, Supt. Hank Hornbeck said a fiveyear plan to put computers in the hands of all students will hopefully be accomplished in two.

This year, some classes piloted a one-to-one program,

giving students Chromebooks.

Next year, officials want to use \$300,000 of working cash funds - what Hornbeck said was like the district's savings account - to purchase Chromebooks for all students in third to eighth grade and tablets for second graders.

Next year, a similar amount is expected to be spent on Chromebooks for high school students and tablets for first grade students. While working cash funds may be used again, Walder said after the meeting that the district will try to find grants to fund the program.

The working cash fund has about \$1.7 million in it, Hornbeck said.
