## Plan to curb wild feline population may be cat's meow

A plan to neuter and vaccinate stray cats is expected to eventually lower the number of strays in Hoopeston.

At Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, Jessica Sempek, a representative of the Illinois Student Chapter of the Association of Shelter Veterinarians with the University of Illinois College of Veterinary Medicine, proposed a plan that is "a kinder, gentler solution that everyone can feel better about."

The plan, called Trap, Neuter, Release (TNR) would involve local volunteers trapping free-roaming cats before veterinary students from the U of I College of Veterinary Medicine bring a mobile unit to spay/neuter, vaccinate and tag the cats, then release them back on the streets.

Vet students are able to treat 40 to 50 cats per visit, Sempek said, adding as more cats are neutered, the population of kittens will decrease.

Sherry Klemme, Hoopeston animal control officer, said 193 cats have been picked up since January. Last year, the total was 266. Of those, only 11 were reclaimed by owners. "We have to get smarter because what we're doing isn't working," she said.

Also, she said, while Hoopeston has a leash law for cats, nobody pays attention to it.

Some of Hoopeston's street cats are feral, defined as being unsuitable to be placed in a home, Sempek said. Others are socialized cats, on the street for various reasons. The socialized cats often connect with "feeders" people willing to feed and sometimes provide shelter for the cats. "Although they won't take responsibility for them, there is an emotional connection," she said.

Many complaints about free-roaming cats - that they spray, bite and fight - will be reduced by neutering, Sempek said.

Cost for the event will be \$15 per cat, which could be offset with a spay/neuter clinic for owned cats at a cost

### of \$30.

If not enough cat owners want their pets neutered, money from the animal control program will pay, said Alderman Brandon Hamilton. At \$15 each, five cats can be done for what the city currently pays for one, he said. Sempek called TNR "a long term solution. There is no See CATS on other side

good short-term solution."

The council did not vote on the issue but indicated Klemme should move ahead in scheduling an event.

In other business, officials hope to move ahead with a plan to reduce flooding.

At a water/sewer meeting Monday, representatives of C2 Engineers, of Danville, made a pitch for a feasibility study, which will include surveying elevations, analyzing data and developing a plan and a cost estimate of the plan, for not more than \$16,360, said Alderman Bill McElhaney.

A 1958 flooding plan was discussed, which included creating three retention areas. One, across from Schumacher's, was built but the others - one across from ADM and one on the north side of Thompson west of the rail tracks - were not done.

The cost of doing the work now would be much higher, said Mayor Bill Crusinberry. "Land prices are six to seven times what they were then," he said. Front Street was also discussed, which, Crusinberry said, has the highest number of main breaks, with somewhere between 20 and 30.

Of the feasibility study, "I think it's time to stop doing studies unless we're going to move forward with it," he said.

The issue is expected to be voted on at the September 1 meeting.
