Jacobs to retire next year after 16 years as DACC president

DANVILLE—After 45 years in higher education, the last 16 as President of Danville Area Community College, Dr. Alice Marie Jacobs announced plans to retire in 2016. "My heart will always be with this exceptional community college," she stated, "but the time is right to turn my focus to my family scattered around the world."

"Despite the current state economic climate, I'm confident that I'm leaving DACC a financially sound and thriving community asset in the hands of talented administrators, dedicated faculty, caring support staff, and a committed board of trustees," she said. "The supportive members of the DACC Foundation board, and the generous donors who make their work possible, have been a true blessing to

work with. I hope to continue to support DACC in any way possible in the future."

Jacobs became the sixth president, and only the second female leader of DACC in September 1999. Her retirement date, while not finalized, will take place between June and December next year.

"My board service began in 1999, shortly after Dr. Jacobs came to the College," remembered DACC board chair Dave Harby. "It has been a pleasure to work with her."

Under Jacobs' leadership, DACC has been a leader in workforce development, reallocating resources to add new locally in-demand programs in health professions and manufacturing. As a result of good stewardship and program growth, Jacobs has expanded and renovated campus facilities and established the Higher Learning Center in Hoopeston to better meet the needs of residents in the northern part of the college district. Local partnerships have been strengthened, particularly those with area K-12 districts and the regional superintendent's office.

"I am especially proud of our student success gains and being named a Leader College in Achieving the Dream, as well as the two successful major gift campaigns for support of DACC students and programs," she said.

Harby reflected on Jacobs' service to her adopted community, the state, and national community college issues. "She came to this community and made it her home. She has embraced not only college concerns, but those of the entire community. She is a state and national leader in community college issues. Her service

outside the college has been as dedicated and impressive as that she gave to DACC."

Since moving to the Danville area, and DACC, Jacobs has served on the American Association of Community Colleges board, including the executive committee; as a co-chair of Gov. Bruce Rauner's Education Policy Transition Committee; as a member of the Illinois board of Higher Education; as chair of the Illinois Community College President's Council; as president of the North Central Association of Two-Year Colleges; as president of the Danville Noon Rotary; as chair of the Danville United Way Campaign; as first chair of the Vermilion Advantage Board; and as president of the Danville Symphony Board.

Her service has been recognized with the 2007 American Association of University Women Woman of

Achievement Award; the 2009 Outstanding Service Award from the Illinois Association of Regional Superintendents of Schools; the 2010 Golden Ruler Award from the Regional Office of Education; and the 2015 Visionary Award from the Eastern Illinois Community Action Agency. Nationally, her leadership skills were recognized by the Association of Community College Trustees in 2007 with the Central Region's Outstanding CEO Award.

Despite state budget uncertainty, Harby said the college has a good reputation for student achievement, is financially sound, and should be appealing to presidential prospects.

For her part, while family will play a much more active role in her future, Jacobs said she can't imagine not being involved with the college. "If there is any way I can help DACC in the future, I will not hesitate." She plans to continue her service to community colleges on a state and national level through her involvement with the Illinois Board of Higher Education and as a peer reviewer through the Higher Learning Commission.
